# The Band is Proud

*To welcome the first two of the candidates for the position of Conductor and Artistic Director of the Loudoun Concert Band. Rick Reaves and Gil Corella, both professional conductors, have worked together with the band to provide an exciting program that shows off the band and the conductors. The final two candidates will conduct the May concert with selection of the Artistic Director in June.*

## Richard B. Reaves

Born and raised in Endicott, New York, Rick comes from a musical family and started playing at the age of seven. He attended college on scholarship and graduated *cum laude* from Union College in Barbourville, Kentucky. He has performed with professional concert bands, symphony orchestras, brass quintets, and jazz ensembles in five states. He has taught music for twenty-two years at the middle, high school and college levels. He spent six years as Tuba Instructor, Director of the Tuba Ensemble, and Brass Techniques Instructor at Sheperd College. He served as principle tuba with the Milbrook Symphony for seven years. He currently performs as bass trombonist and jazz vocalist with the Gary Marval Orchestra, a well known swing band in West Va. He will be featured in performance at Park View High School on March 6th at 7pm.

Mr. Reaves is in his fifth year as Director of Bands and Fine Arts Chairman at Park View High School. He is a member of the Music Educator's National Conference and the Virginia Band and Orchestra Director's Association. Under his direction the band has won numerous awards including The Virginia State Honor Band two of the last four years.

## Gilbert C. Corella

Gil is a native of Miami, Florida and joined the United States Air Force Band, Bolling Air Force Base, in October, 1995. As tubist assigned to the Ceremonial Brass, he has participated in a broad spectrum of ceremonies in the nation's Capitol region ranging from State activities at the White House to full honor funerals at Arlington national Cemetery. He has also performed with and conducted other components of the USAF Band such as the Concert Band and the Chamber Players. He has appeared as soloist with the Ceremonial Brass, the Concert Band, and the Chamber Orchestra. He is a member of the USAF Tuba/Euphonium Quartet.

Mr. Corella attended the University of Texas at Austin from 1981 to 1985. In the summer of 1984 he performed with the Disneyland All-American Band. While in the USAF Band, he completed his Bachelor of Music degree from Catholic University. In May 1997 he completed a Master's degree in conducting and performance at George Mason University. Gil has performed as a soloist and clinician at colleges throughout the United States and is also widely recognized as a traditional jazz tubist. He is currently low brass instructor and wind ensemble director at Charles County Community College in La Plata, Md.
